Feedback on curriculum implementation by the faculty members was obtained through One-to-one discussion. The college has initiated obtaining feedback on curriculum from students, alumni and employers in a structured manner. Outcome of this will be communicated to the University regularly.

Objective: The objective of the exercise is to understand the impact of all the efforts taken by the institution at all levels on the various stakeholders. The institution intend to reach out the benefit all the stakeholders. This feedback is collected and new trends are generated through statistical analysis. Based on the opinion of the stakeholders, further action is taken by the feedback committee. Feedback form are specially made for the students to give their honest opinion and suggestions in order to understand our position among the students community. This includes faculty feedback, alumni feedback, student feedback, course exit survey, etc. A systematic operational procedure is followed in this regard. Faculty feedback from the students for the respective course is taken twice in a semester on various teaching aspects and it is thoroughly analyzed by the respective department heads and necessary measures if any, are informed to the concerned faculties for positive improvements. Course exit feedback and program exit feedbacks are taken to analyses the understanding capability of the students. Special attention is given to acquire feedback about the infrastructural facilities from the final year students at the end of the academic year. The feedback so obtained is analyzed for further improvement. Feedback from the parents are taken by interacting with them during Parent Teacher Meet. Feedback is taken from alumni for suggestions or improvements in the curriculum. Feedback from the final year students are taken for their suggestions in improving the curriculum and it is conveyed to the Chairman, BOS of the respective programs. Feedback from faculties are also taken for their suggestions in syllabus revision. Library has pre-designated feedback forms which are kept on the circulation counter and open to fill-up by any user as per their wish. The collected data is entered in excel sheet and is presented in front of library committee for review and discussion. We have also installed a suggestion box which is accessible to all the stake holders so that they can give their feedback suggestions for improvements, if any. This is a feedback on 5-point scale, which measures parameters like Subject knowledge, Expression, Teaching aids used, methodology etc. which is analyzed by our management for taking appropriate decisions for improving the infrastructure and also quality of teachers. The alumni feedback and exit feedbacks are taken from all students. The feedback is a prime instrument which triggers in continuous improvement in the quality of education. The feedback is taken from students in order to analyze and implement as per their needs and requirements. Also, feedback is taken from experts and external examiners on quality of our students. A unique way of feedback mechanism is followed by taking the feedback from the Guest, invites and dignitaries from various fields on different occasions.

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Minutes of the Governing Council Meeting on 29th March 2022

The meeting started with the Principal, Dr S Samuelson welcoming the members for the meeting. The profile of the new GC member nominated by the Bengaluru City University, Prof M Pandurangappa.

Last meeting's minutes were read and ratification take by Mr Rathod, IQAC co ordinator presented the report of the college in the form of a power point presentation.

Feedback was analysed and discussed.

He initiated the discussion on NEP introducing courses in all fields and recommended that the college apply for BA honours and BSc honours courses. They will be 4 year duration and this can be followed by a one year Masters program. The courses recommended are Electronics, Computer Science, Maths etc. We need to think long term to become a degree awarding institution.

Prof Pandurangappa enquired about the salary given and if there were sufficient funding during COVID. Secretary of AGI Sri Jitendraji Maradia explained that inspite of COVID, salary was credited regularly and good increment was given.

Prof Pandurangappa enquired about the hostel availability. The secretary sir replied that although we are not directly handling the affairs of the hostel, the warden takes care of the day-to day activity but at present there are less students. The college bears the loss.

Prof Pandurangappa enquired about the scholarship that is available for students. IQAC co ordinator explained the process of applying and that many students availed this privilege. It was brought to the notice of the GC members that the scholarship amount was sent directly to students and the college was sometimes not aware that the money was received. Prof Pandurangappa explained that DBC (Direct beneficiary Concept) was introduced because all colleges were not transparent about distributing the scholarship amount to students.

Pro Pandurangappa asked why 10 seats were returned to the University for MCom. It was explained to him that earlier the affiliation amount was per student when it crossed the regular intake but recently another system was introduced – where for the second section, the affiliating fee was for 40 students even when only 10 were sanctioned. It was not financially feasible to run the courses.

Library e content was discussed. IQAC coordinator showed the system followed in our college. Prof Pandurangappa encouraged the members to visit Acharya institute for graduate studies and visit the library.

Professor talked about MOOC courses to be encouraged to students and faculty to better their knowledge.



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He enquired of Placements, Alumni and publications. He requested the management to provide support to faculty during courses work of PhD and support the teaching fraternity.

By 2030 there will be no affiliating universities if NEP is implemented fully and so we need to get prepared. We must generate employable graduates and post graduates. Our system must be upgraded.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks by Ms Veena S

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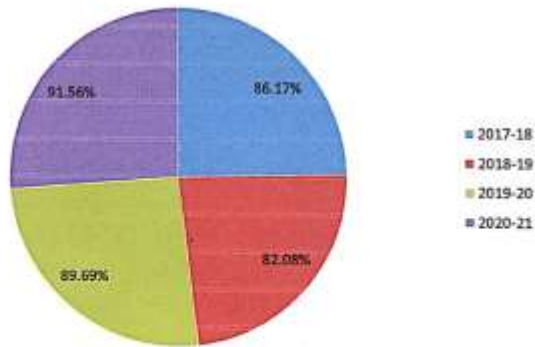
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Result Analysis of BCom outgoing students from the year 2017-21

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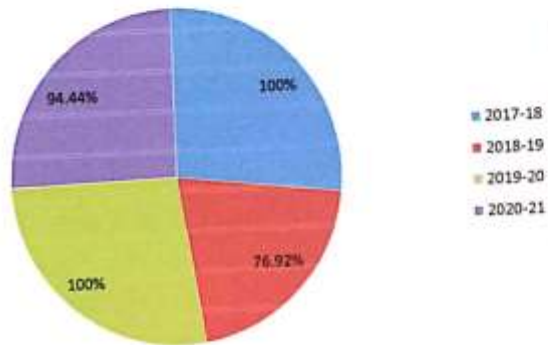
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Result Analysis of BBA outgoing students

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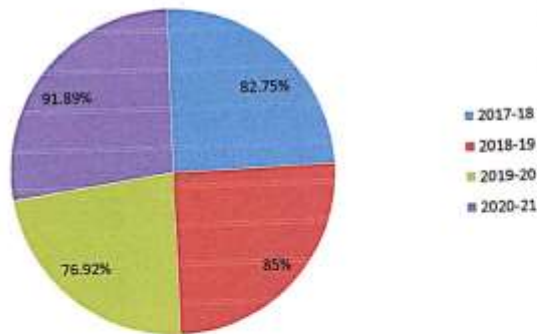
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Result Analysis of BCA outgoing students

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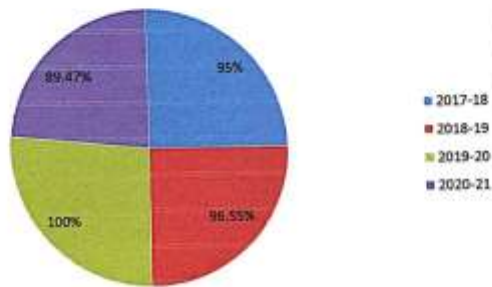
