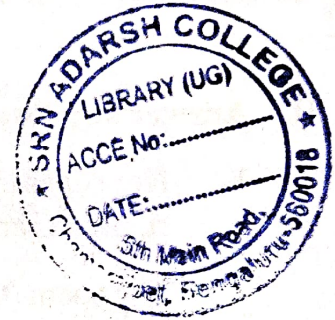

Writing a book review shall not only give insights about a book but even paves a way to form an opinion on the author's views and the context in which the book was written. Usually, book Reviews are given to develop and practice careful analytical reading. A reviewer's task is to bring together certain features such as accuracy, analytical reading and strong response which would indicate what the book is about and what it might mean to a reader. In other words, a reviewer will not only highlight the '5Ws and 1H' about a book but even combine the skills of describing what is on the page, analyzing how the book tried to achieve its purpose, and expressing your own responses and reactions. Some readers confuse book reviews with book reports, yet writing a book review is a very different process from writing a book report. Book reports focus on the plot of the book. Frequently, the aim of book reports is to demonstrate that the books are read, and they are often done for an assignment. A book review is a completely different task. A book review's purpose is to help people decide whether or not the book would interest them enough to read it.
