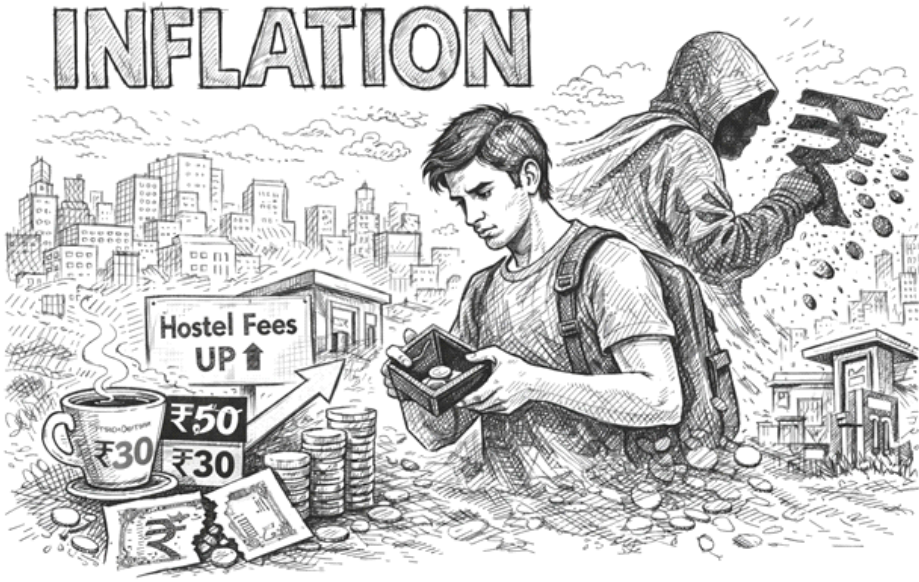

Inflation: The Silent Thief of Your Money

Think about this: the ₹50 coffee you buy on campus today probably cost ₹30 a few years ago. You didn't notice when it happened, but you are paying more. That quiet, steady increase is called inflation—and it affects your future more than you think. As students, we often believe money problems start after we get a job. But

inflation is already working on your pocket. Hostel fees, food, mobile plans, travel, and books slowly become more expensive, even though nothing seems to change overnight. In simple words, inflation means prices rise and the value of money falls. If inflation is around 6% per year, the real value of money becomes almost half in about 12 years. This is why keeping money only in a savings account is not as safe as it feels—you are losing purchasing power every year. Many freshers dream of a good salary and a 10% annual hike. But if inflation is 7%, your real growth is only 3%. Sometimes, when inflation is higher than your salary increase, you are actually moving backwards even though your pay slip looks better. Economists call this the difference between nominal income and real income. Why should students care now? Because your future costs—house, education for your children, healthcare—will be far higher than today. The earlier you understand this, the better you can prepare. The solution is simple but powerful: make your money grow faster than inflation through long-term investing and compounding, even if you start with small amounts. Inflation will not wait for you to graduate. Learning how to beat it now is one of the smartest financial decisions you can make as a student.
